

## **CALGARY, ALBERTA**

Calgary is a safe, clean and vibrant multi-cultural city with a population of over 800,000 citizens serviced by an international airport with direct world-wide flights. Located in the foothills of the magnificent Rocky Mountains, Calgary is a prime destination for experiencing the sophistication of a dynamic urban center and the thrill of a backcountry adventure. Outstanding attractions include the Calgary Zoo, Heritage Park, the Glenbow Museum, and Olympic venues such as the Speed Skating Oval and Canada Olympic Park. The famous Calgary Stampede, held every year in July, attracts more than one million international visitors. The spectacular resorts of Banff, Lake Louise and Alberta's Kananaskis Country are an hour's drive from Calgary and offer visitors a broad scope of activities. Other nearby attractions include the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Paleontology and Dinosaur Provincial Park in the famed Red Deer River "badlands".

## ACCOMMODATION

Blocks of rooms have been booked for delegates both on and off campus. Delegates are encouraged to book early even if you have to cancel or change your reservation at a later date.

There are three types of accommodation; traditional residences, apartment-style suites and hotel style: (refer to website for floorplans)

**Traditional:** This style offers both private and shared dormitory-style rooms. Rooms include single beds, desks and chests of drawers with a common washroom at the end of the hall.

**Apartment-Style:** This style offers both single and double occupancy suites ranging from bachelor, one bedroom, two bedroom and four bedroom apartments. Suites include single beds, bathroom facilities, living/lounge areas and refrigerators. The stoves/ovens are not operational for stays less than 21 nights.

**Note:** the four bedroom suites (8 beds) are ideal for those coming as a group.

\*Please note that the above rooms do not include double beds, televisions or telephones. There are pay telephones and public television lounges throughout the Residence Complex.

**Hotel Style:** These self contained units are equipped with washroom facilities, living area, a mini refrigerator, microwave, coffee maker, colour cable television. Daily room service is provided.

Rates are determined according to single or twin occupancy in addition to the length of stay. Rates range from approximately \$19.50 for shared dorm to \$50 single private suite style and up to \$105 for hotel style private suite, plus applicable taxes. A 5% Provincial Hotel Tax will be assessed to stays shorter than 28 nights while a 7% Federal Goods and Services Tax will be assessed to rates greater than \$20.00 per night. **Please note that all of the rates are per person per night.**

### TRANSPORTATION

The Calgary International Airport is well served by many international and domestic airlines with non-stop flights from Canada, the U.S. and overseas. . It is also possible to reach Calgary by car or bus. Calgary has excellent east-west access along the Trans Canada Highway (Highway #1) and north-south access via Highway #2.

A taxi to the University from the Airport will cost approximately \$25.00 one way. If checking into conference housing , direct the driver to take you to Cascade Hall.
