CEA FELLOWS

CEA FELLOW RUSSELL DAVIDSON

The Canadian Economics Association is delighted to announce the election of Russell Davidson as a Fellow of the Association, the highest honour that the Association can bestow. Davidson, a Professor of Economics at McGill University and a professor emeritus at the Université d'Aix-Marseille II (where he was a professor from 1987 to 2006), is a Fellow of the Econometric Society. He has made major contributions to theoretical econometrics, particularly with regard to bootstrap methods and specification testing, and to the application of the concept of stochastic dominance to the study of income distribution. He has written two books, *Estimation and Inference in Econometrics* (New York: Oxford University Press, 1993) and *Econometric Theory and Method* (New York: Oxford University Press, 2004), both coauthored with James MacKinnon, who is also becoming a Fellow of the Canadian Economic Association today.

Originally from Scotland, Russell Davidson holds two doctorates: a PhD in theoretical physics from the University of Glasgow in 1966, with a thesis on "Kinetics of Plasma in a Uniform Electric Field," and a PhD in economics from the University of British Columbia in 1977, with a thesis entitled "Essays in Comparative Dynamics." He initially came to UBC as a post-doctoral fellow in physics, and has published extensively in both disciplines: 21 journal articles in theoretical physics (two of them more than two decades after receiving his economics PhD) and 74 (and counting) in economics. Most of his economics articles are in theoretical

economics, but some (written with Richard Arnott of Queen's University) were in urban economics, dealing with spatial aspects of housing quality, quantity and maintenance. Russell Davidson joined Queen's University as an assistant professor in 1977, becoming associate professor in 1982 and full professor in 1985. He moved from Queen's to McGill University in 2002 to accept a Tier 1 Canada Research Chair. James MacKinnon had joined Queen's in 1975, and from 1980 onwards Russell Davidson and James MacKinnon have published extensively and influentially together.

Russell Davidson was the Canadian Economics Association's Innis Lecturer in 2010, speaking about "Inference on Income Distribution," *Canadian Journal of Economics* 43:4 (November 2010), 1122-1148. He was President of the Association in 2014-15, giving his presidential address on "Computing, the Bootstrap and Economics," *Canadian Journal of Economics* 48:4 (November 2015), 1195-1214. These public addresses provide the most accessible introductions to his work on bootstrap methods in econometrics and the application of stochastic dominance and bootstrapping to the empirical study of income distribution.

CEA FELLOW JAMES MACKINNON

The Canadian Economics Association is delighted to announce the election of James G. MacKinnon as a Fellow, the highest honour that the Association can bestow. James MacKinnon, the Sir Edward Peacock Professor of Econometrics at Queen's University, is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and of the Econometric Society. He has made major contributions to theoretical econometrics, particularly with regard to bootstrap methods and specification testing. He has written two books, *Estimation and Inference in Econometrics* (New York: Oxford University Press, 1993) and *Econometric Theory and Method* (New York: Oxford

University Press, 2004), both coauthored with Russell Davidson, who is also becoming a Fellow of the Canadian Economics Association today.

James MacKinnon graduated from Glendon College, the bilingual college of York University, and received his PhD in economics from Princeton University in 1975. His dissertation supervisor at Princeton, with whom he published on the sandwich method for finding fixed points, was Harold Kuhn (of the Kuhn-Tucker conditions for constrained optimization). James joined Queen's University as an assistant professor in 1975 and has stayed with Queen's since then (as associate professor from 1978, full professor from 1982, Peacock Professor since 1991). In addition to what subsequently became his main work in theoretical econometrics, he published several early articles with Richard Arnott applying general equilibrium analysis to urban economics. Russell Davidson joined Queen's two years after James, initiating an exceptionally fruitful collaboration (their first journal article in 1980 was James's twentieth article). Together with Charles Beach, James MacKinnon organized and hosted the first meeting of the Canadian Econometric Study Group in 1984 (and he also organized and hosted the CESG's 1997 and 2012 meetings).

James MacKinnon was president of the Canadian Economics Association in 2001-2002, giving a presidential address on "Bootstrap Inference in Econometrics," *Canadian Journal of Economics* 35:4 (November 2002), 615-645. The remarkable increase in computing power made it possible to base statistical inference on simulated, or bootstrap, distributions based on resampling rather than on distributions suggested by asymptotic theory that are strictly valid only when the sample size is infinitely large. MacKinnon (2002, p. 617) argued that "This bootstrap approach can often, but does not always, lead to much more accurate inference than traditional approaches are capable of." His presidential address provides an accessible introduction to the work of Davidson and MacKinnon on bootstrapping.

CEA FELLOW JOHN WHALLEY

The Canadian Economics Association is delighted to announce the election of John Whalley as Fellow of the Association, the highest honour that the CEA can bestow. John Whalley has made enormous contributions to computable general equilibrium and its application to international trade, public finance, global climate change, and the Chinese economy. He is a tremendously influential and prolific scholar: the section of his CV listing his most recent publications, those since 2010, includes sixty-two refereed journal articles, and he has trained generations of young economists, sending them forth from graduate school with records of significant coauthored publication. John Whalley is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and of the Econometric Society, was the Canadian Economics Association's Innis Lecturer in 1984, and in 2012 won the Killam Prize, awarded to recognize an outstanding Canadian researcher

John Whalley grew up in Lancashire, English, and received his bachelor's and master's degree at the University of Essex. He took his PhD in economics at Yale University in 1973, with a thesis applying computable general equilibrium analysis to "A Numerical Assessment of the April 1973 Tax Changes in the United Kingdom." Herbert Scarf, who developed the first fixed-point algorithm to compute general equilibrium, was on Whalley's dissertation committee, which was chaired by William Brainard. After lecturing at the London School of Economics for three years, Whalley joined the University of Western Ontario as an associate professor in 1976 (full professor in 1978), and has remained ever since at Western, where he is Co-Director of the Centre for the Study of International Economic Relations (CSIER) and Director of the China Research and Policy Group (CRPG). He is a Research Associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) and is the Coordinator of the Global Economy Group of CESifo. He has written, coauthored, edited or co-edited forty books and has published awe-inspiring numbers of articles in the most respected

and highly-ranked economics journals: twelve in the *Journal of Public Economics*, seven in each of the *American Economic Review* and the *Journal of International Economics*, six in each of the *Economic Journal, Economics Letters*, the *Journal of Development Economics* and the *Review of Economics and Statistics*, five in the *Journal of Political Economy*, three in each of *Econometrica* and the *Journal of Economic Theory*. The list of his journal articles is longer than most journal articles. His career in research, and in the training of young researchers, has been one of outstanding achievement, and the Canadian Economics Association is proud to honour John Whalley as a Fellow of the Canadian Economics Association.

HARRY JOHNSON PRIZE / LE PRIX HARRY JOHNSON

The Harry Johnson Prize for the best article published in the *Canadian Journal of Economics* in 2015 was awarded to **Gregor Smith** (Queen's University) and **Nicolas-Guillaume Martineau** (Glendon College of York University) for "Identifying Fiscal Policy (In)effectiveness from the Differential Counter-Cyclicality of Government Spending in the Interwar Period" published in Volume 48 of the *Canadian Journal of Economics*.

MIKE McCRACKEN AWARD FOR ECONOMIC STATISTICS / LE PRIX McCRACKEN

The Mike McCracken Award recognizes theoretical and applied contribution to the development or use of economic statistics in Canada. Sadly Mike McCracken died since our last meetings. He was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma and received his Ph.D. from Rice. His Canadian career began at the Economic Council of Canada and then in 1972 he co-founded Informetrica, a Canadian-based economic research company. He served as president of the Canadian Association of Business Economists for a number of

years and was chair of the U.S. Conference of Business Economists in 1994. He is well known within Canada for the many ways he contributed to the development of economic statistics: in particular he was a strong supporter of Statistics Canada, the Canadian Employment Research Forum and the Canadian Econometric Study Group. In 2010, he was the first winner of this award which bears his name.

This year the committee has chosen to honour **Russell Davidson** of McGill University and **James MacKinnon** of Queen's University. Both are widely known for their important econometric research individually, with other co-authors and with each other. But the nominators also emphasized their roles in the advancement of econometrics and economic statistics in Canada, including the professional development of others through their efforts in this Association and the Canadian Econometric Study Group and their role in teaching so many of us formally and informally, not least through their influential textbooks.

ROBERT MUNDELL PRIZE / LE PRIX ROBERT MUNDELL

The Robert Mundell Prize for the best article published in the *Canadian Journal of Economics* in 2015 by an early-career economist was awarded to **Alex Chernoff** for the paper "Between a Cap and a Higher Price: Modeling the Price of Dairy Quotas under Price Ceiling Legislation" published in Volume 48 of the *Canadian Journal of Economics*.

DOUG PURVIS MEMORIAL PRIZE / LE PRIX DOUG PURVIS

The Doug Purvis Prize is awarded annually to the authors of a highly significant, written contribution to Canadian economic policy. The winner of the Doug Purvis Memorial Prize for 2015 is **The Ecofiscal Commission** for their report "The Way Forward: A Practical Approach to Reducing Canada's Greenhouse Gas Emissions"

THE JOHN VANDERKAMP PRIZE / LE PRIX JOHN VANDERKAMP

The Vanderkamp Prize is for the best article in the journal *Canadian Public Policy/Analyse de Politiques* each year. For 2015 the selection committee of Tammy Schirle, Lisa Strohschein and Mike Veall would like to acknowledge two runners-up:

OBITUARIES

The Canadian Economics Association announces with sadness the passing of Albert Breton, president of the CEA in 1988-89, and of A. Edward Safarian, president of the CEA in 1976-77.

ALBERT BRETON (1948-2016)

86 years, of Toronto, died peacefully at home on February 13, 2016, surrounded by his family in the last days of his life. Emeritus Professor of Economics, University of Toronto, he received his Ph.D. in Economics from Columbia University, New York City. He taught at the Université de Montréal, Carleton University, Université Catholique de Louvain, the London School of Economics, Harvard University, the Università di Perugia, the Université de Paris I (Panthéon-Sorbonne) and the Institut de Sciences Politiques de Paris. He worked as a researcher at the Institute for Social and Economic Change (Bangalore, India). He was the author of over 130 books and articles on questions of federalism, constitutionalism and economic theory and policy. He was Special Advisor to Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau for 10 years through the 1970s, while still teaching at the University of Toronto. From 1979 to 1982, he was vice-chairman of the Applebaum-Hébert Federal Cultural Policy Review Committee and, from 1982 to 1985, he was a Commissioner with the Macdonald Royal Commission on the Economic Union and Development Prospects for Canada. He served on the Board of Governors of the National Theatre School of Canada and on the Canadian Economic Policy Committee of the C.D. Howe Research Institute. He was an Officer of The Order of Canada since 1984 and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada since 1979. He had an LL.D. (Honoris Causa) from the University of Manitoba. He was a past President of the Canadian Economics Association. A Festschrift in his honour was published in 2000 by Cambridge University Press. He was a man of enormous character and great warmth; he was funny, kind, loving and always the life of the party. He leaves his wife, Margot; his children, Catherine (Carol Manak), Natalie, Françoise, Robert (Lindsey McMaster); his

grandchildren, Sophia, Liv and William; his brothers, Raymond (Lily), Gabriel and Roland (Diane) and sister, Claire (Etienne Gaboury), all of whom loved him immensely and will miss him terribly. JOHN LEWIS KNIGHT (1948-2016)

John Lewis Knight, Professor of Economics at the University of Western Ontario, passed away on January 21, 2016, in London, UK, following a nine month battle with cancer. Knight was born in Earlwood, NSW, Australia, on September 12, 1948. He earned a B. Comm. in Statistics in 1971, a M. Comm. in Econometrics in 1973, and a Ph.D. in Economics in 1980, all at The University of New South Wales. Knight began his academic career as a Lecturer at The University of New South Wales, and was a Senior Lecturer there from 1983-1986. He visited the University of Western Ontario in 1985 and was subsequently recruited to Western in 1987, where he taught econometrics and financial econometrics for 28 years. Knight maintained friendships globally with a wide circle of people, frequently visiting Birbeck College at University of London, Trinity College at Cambridge, The University of New South Wales, and Hiroshima University.

John Knight was an internationally known expert in the fields of econometrics and financial econometrics. His early research in econometrics involved the application of distribution theory to economic problems. Later, he specialized in the use of the empirical characteristic function in the estimation of financial time series data. He published 60 papers in journals and edited volumes, and held NSERC grants continuously throughout his career at Western. Many of his papers were co-authored with his long-time friend and collaborator, Stephen Satchell. Knight and

Satchell also edited four books together on various econometric aspects of financial markets, including forecasting volatility and performance measurement. In 2002, he was awarded the *Econometric Theory* Plura Scripsit Award for having published over 15 papers in *Econometric Theory*. He was a member of the editorial board of the *Journal of Asset Management* for 10 years from 2004 to 2014, and he was an Honorary Associate of the Financial Econometric Projects at Cambridge from 2002 to 2009.

At Western, Knight is remembered most for his work with graduate students. He supervised or was a committee member for over 25 students. He was a thoughtful and considerate supervisor who kept track of his students and their career successes long after they finished their degrees. He also often formed long-term working relationships with his students, having co-authored 13 papers with former students.

Recently, Knight played a lead role in the development of a new Master of Financial Economics (MFE) at Western. As its External Director in 2014-2015, he was instrumental in stewarding new donor-sponsored scholarships which provide financial support to students. He expanded the program's employer network to improve internship and full-time job prospects for MFE students.

John Knight was predeceased by his loving wife, Mary Therese (McGrane) (2008), and his parents, John Knight (1972) and Patricia Gloria (Haigh) Knight (1995). He was a loving brother to Patricia Dawn Gibb and Lynette Anne Rocca of NSW. He will be missed by his extended family, colleagues, students and friends world-wide.

ED SAFARIAN

It is with sadness that I inform the Rotman community that Professor Emeritus Ed Safarian passed away on January 30th, 2016. He was 94. Until the last year he had been an active member of the Rotman community pursuing research, mentoring colleagues, and contributing to the public discourse on public policy issues. He will be sorely missed here at Rotman and by his many friends and colleagues around the world.

A Professor of Business Economics at the University of Toronto since 1966, Ed served as President of the Canadian Economics Association (1977-78) and as Dean of the School of Graduate Studies, University of Toronto (1971-76). He has been a major contributor to our understanding of multinational enterprises and of public policy through his pioneering books *The Canadian Economy in the Great Depression* (1958), *Foreign Ownership of Canadian Industry* (1966), *Canadian Federalism and Economic Interpretation* (1973), *Governments and Multinationals: Policies in the Developed Countries* (1983) and *Multinational Enterprise and Public Policy: A Study of the Industrial Countries* (1993). In 2011 University of Toronto Press published an updated third edition of his *Foreign Ownership of Canadian Industry*. That Fall Ed gave a public talk at Rotman partly based on it to over 100 people.

Ed has been a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada since 1973. In 1977 he was awarded a Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee Medal. In 2005 he was named a Member of the Order of Canada for his contributions to the social sciences, which included research on multinational enterprises, international trade and investment, Canadian federalism, the Great Depression of the 1930's, and public policy.

Ed's family noted that January 30, 2016 was his 66th wedding anniversary and that it was a good day to be reunited with his wife Joan, who passed away in September 2014.

Our deepest sympathies go to the Safarian family.
